New York attorney JOSHUA COLANGELO-BRYAN provides pro-bono representation for Bahraini nationals currently imprisoned at Guantanamo. Having visited the prison in Cuba 11 times, his work has been featured in the New York Times, The Washington Post, the Miami Herald and on NPR. He will speak about the lives and treatment of his clients, as well as the implications of their imprisonment for U.S. democracy.
